Things you must budget:

- Transportation Expenses:
 - Gas (all trips, but mainly road trip)
 - account for an average of **30 mpg**, at a rate of **\$3.50/gallon**
 - use google maps to calculate distance
 - o Flight?
 - Campsite fee?
 - Cruise tickets?
- Housing:
 - Hotel, RV(12 mpg), Tents, Cruise Ship, etc. (What does it look like? Does it have a view?)
- Food:
 - Groceries/snacks
 - Eating out
- Attractions/Events:
 - Shows, concerts, Museums, etc. (What are you going to do while on vacation?)
